

ADEGAMÃE TERROIR 2013

The first white of Lisbon

Distinguished with the Excellence Award

This is the first time a white wine from the Lisboa Region gets the highest award in Portuguese winemaking.

The 2013 AdegaMãe Terroir White, a new high-end AdegaMãe white wine, won the Excellence Award at the annual gala hosted by the Revista dos Vinhos, a key publication in the sector that each year stages a show otherwise known as the Oscars of Portuguese wine. This award, the most important ever won by AdegaMãe in its short seven year existence, is also of historical relevance to the Lisboa Wine Region: this is the first time a white wine from the Lisboa Region gets the highest award in Portuguese winemaking.

Honoring a Lisboa producer with the Excellence Award may seem in itself a remarkable feat, but it sheds light on a new quality trend emerging in the wines from the region. In the specific case of AdegaMãe, winning the Excellence Award is consistent with other recent awards that attest the quality associated with this Torres Vedras winery: in the last edition of “Encontro com o Vinho e Sabores” another white wine produced at AdegaMãe, the Dory Reserva, won the Grande Prémio Escolha da Imprensa [Press Choice Award].

AdegaMãe Terroir Branco 2013

Grape varieties: Viosinho, Alvarinho and Arinto.

Tasting notes: Complex, mineral and smoked aroma. Voluminous on the palate, this is an unctuous wine with steady acidity and a salty finish.

Recommended price: 39 euros.
